# The Athens Olympic Museum

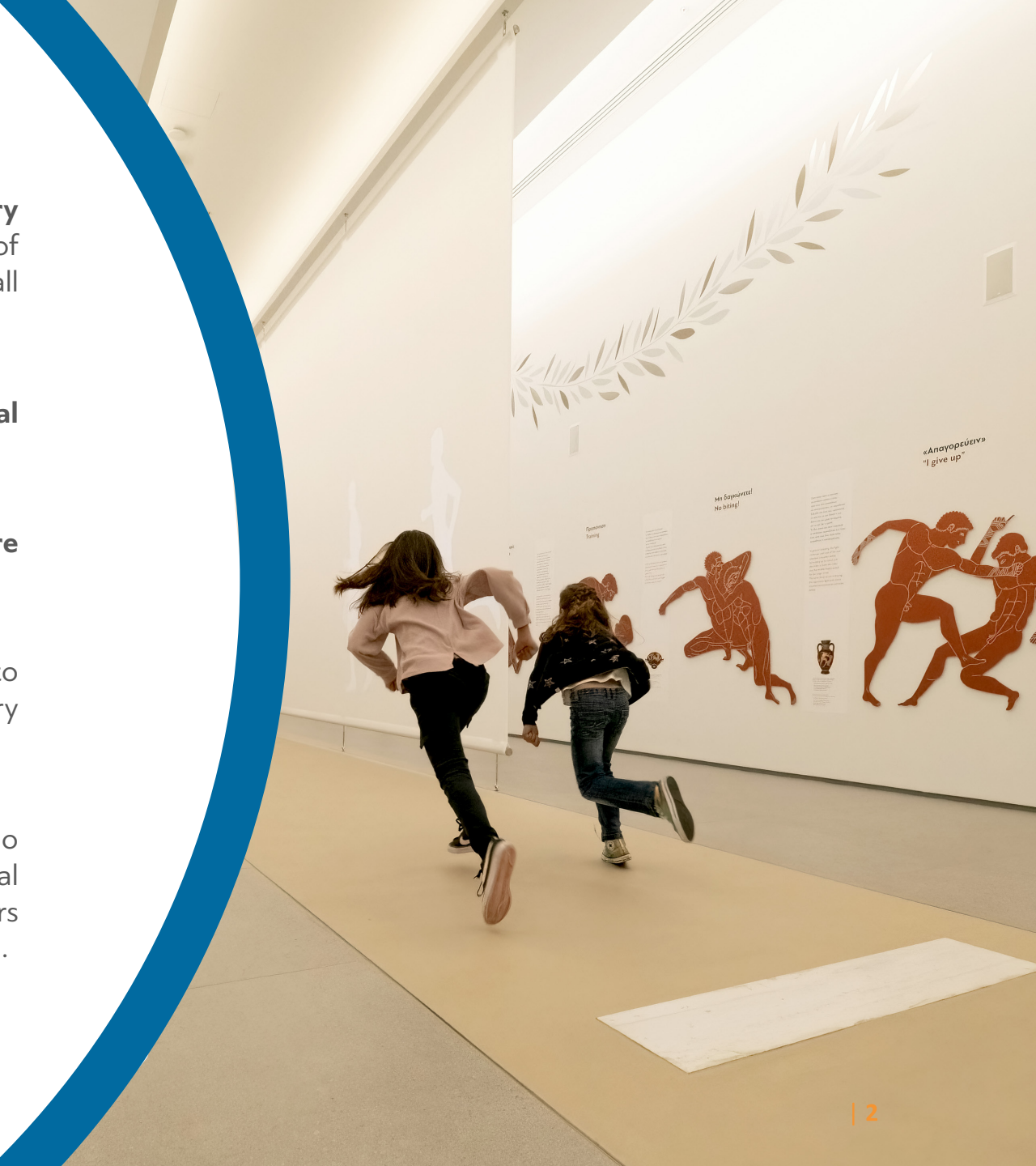
The Athens Olympic Museum, situated in Golden Hall, is a **contemporary museum in the capital of the Olympic Games**, which serves as the guardian of the tangible and intangible Olympic heritage, and a hub of knowledge for all generations.

It leverages **new technologies** and applies the **principles of experiential design** to enrich the visitors' educational experience.

It promotes the strong connection between **Sports, Education** and **Culture** and highlights the utilization of the legacy of the Games in Athens.

The Museum's **Permanent Exhibition** offers an original narrative approach to the history of the Olympic Games, from their birth in mythology and their glory in Ancient Olympia, to their revival and their modern versions.

Audio and tactile exhibits, award-winning interactive installations, audio narratives, short film screenings, a collection of valuable objects, personal stories of athletes and digital content seamlessly combine to guide visitors through the history of the Olympics all along the entire Permanent Exhibition.

  - 1 facilitator per 10-15 children, depending on their age (supplementary fee)

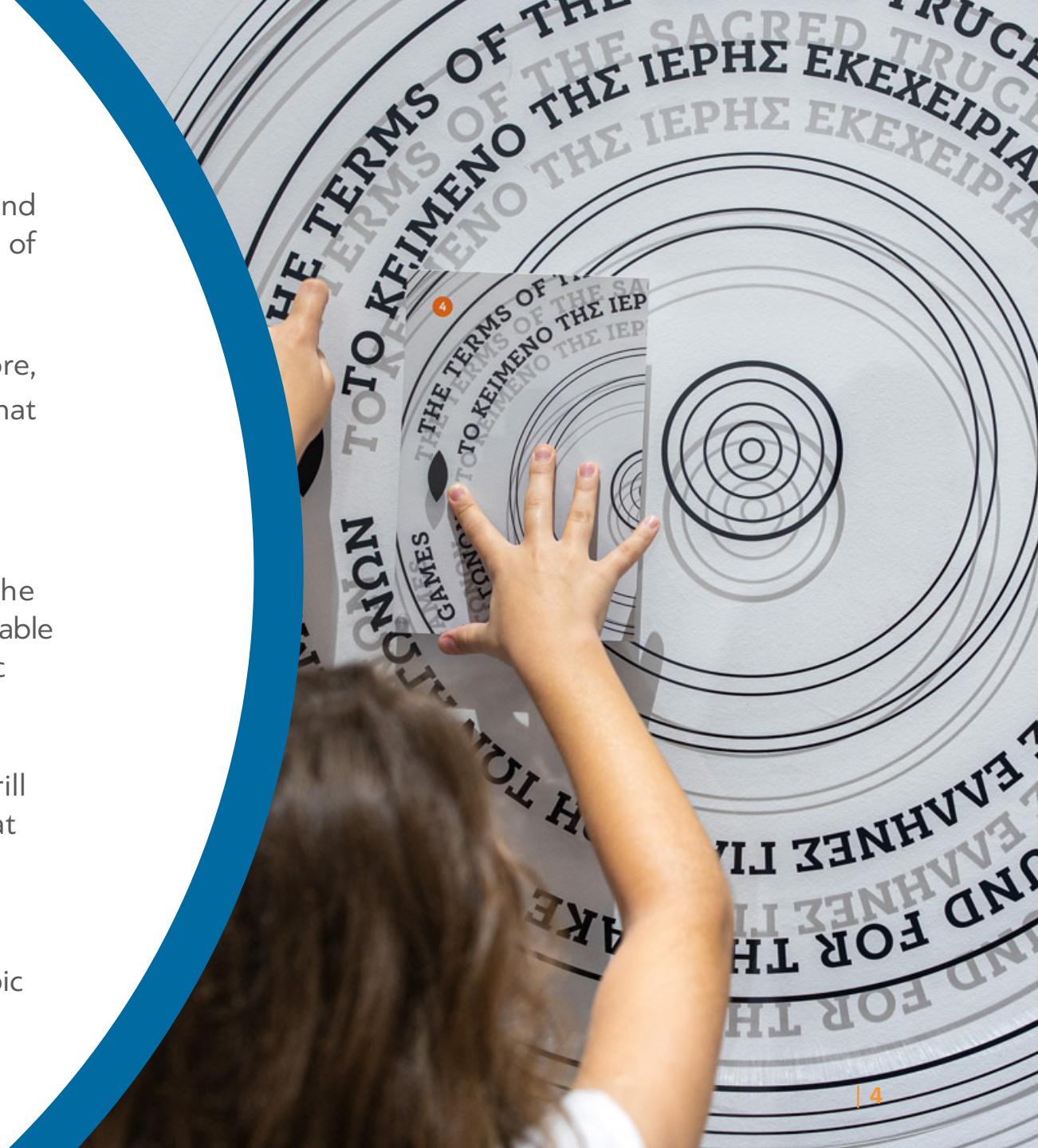
## Interactive Programmes

# The 1896 Event Hall

The 1896 Event Hall of the Museum presents a remarkable aesthetic appeal, providing a distinctive experience that will leave lasting memories for your children and guests.

Golden Hall Shopping Centre features a separate entrance and convenient access to the parking area (grey sector).

The minimal decoration allows for easy customization of the space to suit the specific requirements of your event.

- **Maximum number of guests:** 90 people (depending on the set-up)
- **Total surface area:** 160 sq.m.
- **Catering:** Two options are provided by reliable partners (upon request)



# The 1896 Foyer

The 1896 Foyer, located on the mezzanine level of the Museum, can be accessed both in conjunction with the 1896 Event Hall and as an independent space.

The modern and elegant design, featuring natural light and a clear view of the Olympic facilities, seamlessly blends high aesthetics with functionality.

A range of layout options and decorative choices can be provided.

Access is available through a dedicated entrance on the 1st floor of Golden Hall Shopping Centre. Alternatively, visitors may use the main staircase, or the elevator located within the Museum.

Easy access for individuals with disabilities.

- **Total surface area:** 350 sq.m.

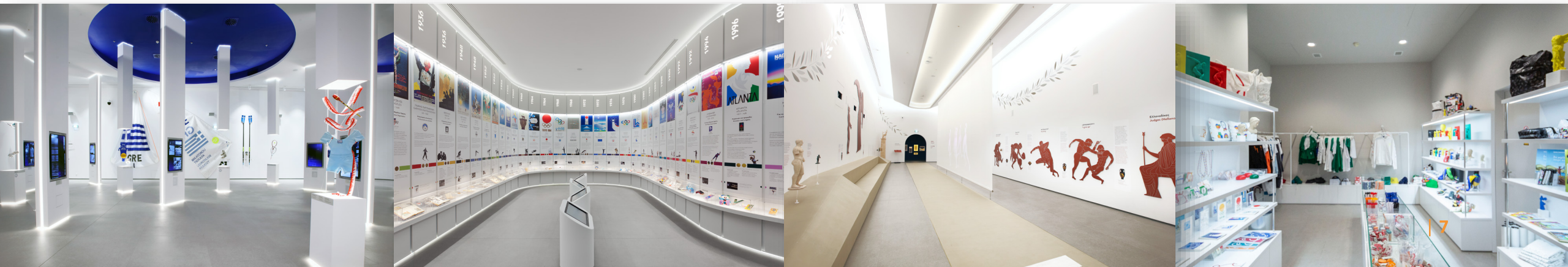

# Access to the Museum

The Athens Olympic Museum is situated in the western section of the former International Broadcasting Center (IBC), originally built for ATHENS 2004, which now houses the Golden Hall Shopping Center, on Kifissias Avenue. The Museum can be accessed in multiple ways:



## For pedestrians

### From Level 0 – Main Entrance of the Museum:

Through the pedestrian bridge connecting the Museum to the Olympic Athletic Center of Athens "Spyros Louis" (OAKA).

### From Level 1 – Lounge of the Museum:

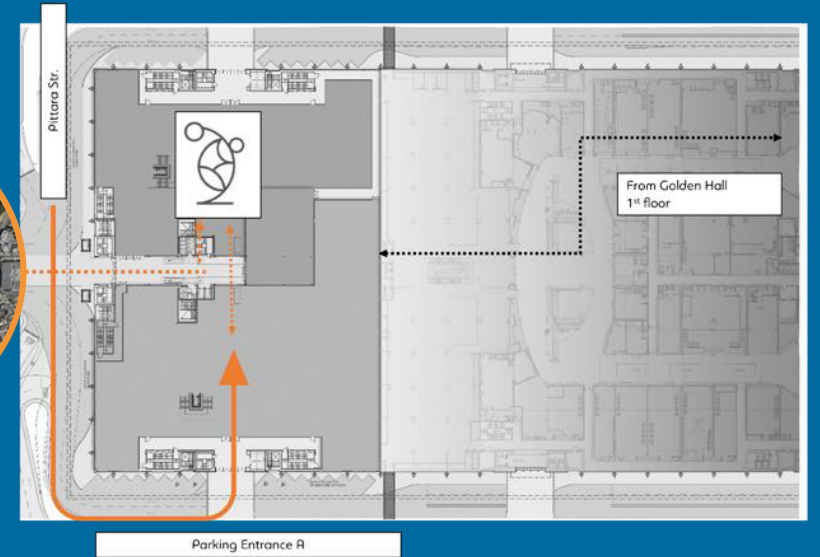
Via the Museum's internal staircase.



## By road

The Museum is just 15-minutes away by car from both the city centre and the Northern Suburbs. You can arrive either via Kifissias Avenue or via Attiki Odos.

Parking is offered within Golden Hall at a low rate. Entrance A provides direct access to the grey sector of the parking area, allowing visitors to access the Athens Olympic Museum (Level 0) conveniently via elevators.
